1. The Applicants, Canada Overseas Petroleum Limited ("COPL") and those other entities listed in Schedule "A" hereto, seek a one-day stay extension order substantially in the form attached as Schedule "D" hereto, extending the Stay Period (as defined in the order granted by the Honourable Justice Sidnell of the Court of King's Bench of Alberta (the "Court") in the within proceedings on March 8, 2024 (the "Initial Order")), including the stay of proceedings against the entities listed in Schedule "B" hereto (the "Non-Filing Affiliates" and together with the Applicants, the "COPL Group"), up to and including March 19, 2024.


